

Traidcraft - Fighting poverty through trade

Traidcraft has contacted Archbishop Peter, to ask for his support.

Traidcraft started out 35 years ago. They trade with and support vulnerable farmers and artisans. They also pioneer bringing new commodities to the fair trade market. Their linked development charity runs development projects to enable people to trade their way out of poverty.

Traidcraft are now a kind of victim of their own success. While they were the pioneers of fair trade, they do not get any benefits from the Fairtrade trade in supermarkets, etc. They will shortly be publishing their accounts which show a trading loss for a fourth consecutive year.

Detention Centres/London churches Refugee Network Meeting

The meeting was well attended with committed people and leaders of various faiths. The first hand account of an ex-detainee, showed that even though he is physically free, the mental trauma continues.

The day this meeting was held, a very important milestone has been reached. The Court of Appeals ruled against the government's proposal to bring back the Detained Fast Track, as the court recognised the potentially disastrous consequences for an Asylum seeker. Eiri encouraged people to attend the Detention Enquiry scheduled for 10 September, 2015.

It is an opportunity to convey your views to your local MP and MEP too. There is a possibility of your views being mentioned during the debate. If your MP is not attending the debate, request him/her to do so. Network and form a group, rather than go alone.
